Under Housing Benefit rules, 2 children under the age of 10 of any sex, or 2 children under the age of 16 of the same sex would be expected to share a bedroom. The Council has to decide how many bedrooms a family needs when working out how much Housing Benefit is due.

However, if a child has a severe disability that would mean they would disturb the sleep of another child who shared a room with them, a separate bedroom can be allowed.

Further Guidance

The Council has to decide whether the child's /children's disabilities are such that it is inappropriate for a bedroom to be shared.

This means we have to consider the nature and severity of the disability and also the extent and how regularly the sleep of any other child who would normally be required to share the bedroom would be disturbed. In all cases this will come down to a matter of judgment on the facts.

What is their medical condition?
