School Travel Discussion Exercise

This is a discussion based exercise using prompts to encourage pupils to think about the specific travel issues at their school. Pupils work in small groups then discuss and compare opinions as a class. The activity is suitable for use in class, School Council or with an environment group.

Equipment needed:

• 1 copy of the 20 discussion statements per group.

How to run the discussion:

1. In small groups ask pupils to read through the 20 statements and separate into two piles;

Things that happen at this school and Things that do not happen at this school.

- 2. Go through the statements as a class to compare how each group have allocated them.
- 3. In small groups, now get the pupils to sort through the things that happen at this school pile and split them into positive and negative.

Feedback and discuss sorting as a class.

As a class, go through the negative statements and decide on the three most important ones to their school, ranking them 1 - 3. Encourage them to think about why they are important,

- who is causing the problem
- what could happen
- when does this happen
- who is effected by the problem.

What could be done at the school to reduce the three main negative travel problems?

Ask pupils to produce a letter to parents, governors, city council, a poster, leaflet or a newspaper article (select appropriate for group) that:

- identifies one of the final 3 negative travel problems
- explains who the problem is effecting and how
- suggests how the situation could be improved.
