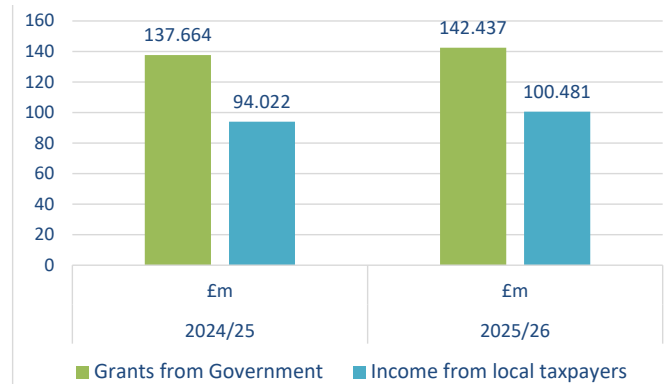
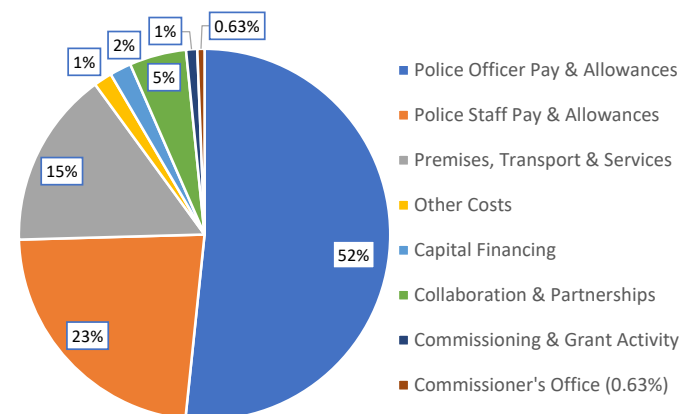

Through our recent budget survey, many residents have expressed their support for contributing more towards tackling crime and addressing local policing priorities.

Some of the things this year's
budget will support are:

Serious Violence including VAWG

- **Domestic Abuse Teams:** Strengthening resources to improve outcomes.
- **Introduction of Victim Liaison Officers:** Providing early support for victims of rape and serious sexual abuse.
- **Smart Water:** Continued investment to protect victims of domestic abuse and stalking.
- **Operation Sceptre:** Targeting knife crime and awareness raising.

ASB & Community Safety

- **Immediate Justice Scheme:** Ensuring offenders pay back into communities.
- **Hotspot Patrols:** Targeting anti-social behaviour.
- **Geo-fencing Patrol Technology:** Informing the public about police activities.
- **E-scooter Enforcement:** Seizing more from our communities.

Neighbourhood Policing

- **New PCSO Investigators:** To improve outcomes for victims of neighbourhood crime.
- **Dedicated Rural Crime Team:** To tackle rural criminality.
- **Continuation of more police officers:** Surpassing government targets.
- **Home Burglary Response:** Police attendance and CSI support for every reported home burglary.
- **Technology Investment:** Reducing 101 call waiting times and improving customer experience.

Bringing Offenders to Justice

- **Clear, Hold, Build Project:** Tackling organised crime in partnership.
- **Investigations Programme:** Improving the quality of investigations.
- **Quarterly enforcement operations:** Targeting high-risk suspects.
- **Increased use of protective orders:** To target repeat offenders and protect vulnerable victims.

Drug Dealing and Substance Misuse

- **Outreach Services:** Support for young people with substance misuse issues.
- **Drugs Testing on Arrest:** To understand the impact of drug abuse in our county.
- **Naloxone:** Issued to officers to reduce the effects of drug overdose.
- **Tackling County Lines:** Focus on dismantling and asset recovery.

Supporting Victims and Safeguarding

- **A new Victim Care Team:** Ensuring victims' needs are met.
- **Improved High Harm Function:** Tackling serial and repeat offenders.
- **Continued focus on Civil Orders:** Providing extra control measures on offenders.
- **Multi-Agency Tasking & Coordination Pilot** – Targeting domestic abuse perpetrators.
