What's coming up in Derby . . .

Thrive Open event in conjunction with Becket Primary School, Derby

We have now scheduled the Open event with Ruth Varley from Becket Primary for Tuesday 4th May 2pm-3.30pm.

Current brain science shows that for many young people in school, their stress management, emotional regulation, and seeking /exploring systems are not yet sufficiently developed for them to access learning. The Thrive Approach has been developed to address these needs. It equips staff to see and understand behaviour as communication and it gives them the tools and techniques to support the emotional and social development needed to access learning.

The live webinar is aimed at Heads/SENCo's and Strategic Leads. It will give you the opportunity to hear first-hand how an established Thrive setting in Derby City is using Thrive and learn how the Thrive Approach works in practice.

5 Sensory Open Bus Sessions in Derby (for schools)

Derby City is offering free sensory sessions for children and young people with varying levels of Special Educational Needs through The Riley Foundation Sensory Bus Project. These sessions are aimed for anyone in need of anxiety relief following COVID- 19 aged 5-15 years.

The session is for 45minutes on the hour and can host between 3 to 15 participants depending on the need. The bus is cleaned thoroughly after each session.

Learn more about Kooth and Qwell

Kooth & Qwell provide a safe, secure means of accessing help via the internet. KOOOTH supports young people throughout Derby City & County between the ages of 11 & 25. QWELL supports any Parent or Carer.

By accessing these services, users can benefit from:

- A free, confidential, anonymous, and safe way to receive support online.
- Out of hours' availability. Counsellors are available from 12noon to 10pm on weekdays and 6pm to 10 pm at weekends, every day of the year.
- Online Counselling from a professional team of BACP qualified counsellors is available via 1-1 chat sessions or a 24hr messaging service.
- Discussion Boards are all pre-moderated allowing users to access peer to peer support networks.
- Online Magazines full of moderated articles many of which are submitted by young people on Kooth and Parents/Carers on Qwell. Articles offer advice and guidance on a huge range of topics.
- No referral is required. Service users simply sign up when they need support.

Autism Dialogue

Over recent months we have held a series of special online events, hosted by Dialogica in partnership with Derby City Council and Derby CCG, using the unique Autism Dialogue Approach. The Autism Dialogue sessions, have provided a chance for people to have your voice heard and connect with others in the Autism community, providing a safe space to share your thoughts and experiences and within an Autism friendly environment.

The first part of this work culminated in an interactive webinar 30 April 2021. The webinar was focussed on actively helping to influence the future of the Autism landscape in Derbyshire and beyond.

- Collective voices working to embed equality for autistic people

Improving outcomes in EHCPs

Derby City Council, Derbyshire County Council and Derby College's Centre for Excellence in SEND are working together. Join us for our series of professional discussions about improving outcomes for young people with EHCPs

In each newsletter we will tell you a little bit more about one of our teams or services. This time we are . . .

Introducing the EHCP team

The EHCP team at Derby City Council are responsible for coordinating education, health, and care needs assessments, writing EHCPs and then ensuring that they are kept up to date, through the annual review process.

The team deals with over 450 requests for needs assessments each year and now maintains over 2700 EHCPs in the City. The EHCP team is also responsible for agreeing any additional funding that a school or setting might need to deliver the EHCP and for personal budgets, including direct payments.

Demand on the team has grown significantly over the past few years as more children across the City have accessed needs assessments. As result in the past 6 months the team has grown too. There's now 12 SEND (EHCP) Officers working across the City's localities. Each officer has several linked schools and they are now working increasingly closely with SENCOs to support with the delivery of EHCPs. In addition to the 12 officers, there's one senior officer who supports with tribunals and complex cases, three caseworkers who help to support the assessment process and admin support who will deal with incoming documentation and queries.

Living my best life – about our local area vision for SEND



Last year we launched our new local area SEND strategy. Later this year we will be using this strategy to help us to co-produce our new action plan, setting out our priorities as we move away from our current written statement of action. This work will start with a series of workshops in May to gather the views of parents and professionals in the City.

Our strategy is made up of five main areas. We'll be focussing on one of our strategic priorities in each of our next few newsletters.

Priority 1 – How we work together as a local area

- We are all professionally generous and open
- In Derby, children and young people come first
- As a local area we work together to co-construct new policies and practices
- Parents, carers, and young people are treated as experts by experience

Local area OFSTED and CQC inspections

From April 2021, Ofsted and the Care Quality Commission will start revisiting areas with a written statement of action in place.

Re-inspections are usually expected within 18 months of a written statement of action being finalised. In the case of Derby, this means an inspection could take place at any point over the summer.

As part of our preparation for this work the DfE and NHSE have been carrying out regular formal review meetings to track our progress against what we said we would do and to support us to ensure that we are able to demonstrate the work that we have done since 2019.

Inspections will also focus on:

- area leaders' understanding of the impact of the pandemic on children and young people with SEND in Derby and on the local SEND system more widely
- how leaders have used their understanding to adapt their plans to address the areas of significant weakness detailed in the WSOA
